



Knowledge Bowl

What is it? Who participates? How does it benefit kids?

Sr. High Knowledge Bowl is an interdisciplinary academic contest designed for students in grades 9 – 12. Teams of students compete in written and oral rounds by answering questions related to all areas of learning typical of secondary educational programs. Questions test students' recall, problem solving, and critical thinking skills. A team consists of five members (one serves as an alternate). Knowledge Bowl was introduced in Minnesota in 1979 with 8 high schools participating. Enthusiastic support increased those numbers to over 821 teams from 290 school districts statewide in 2008-2009.
