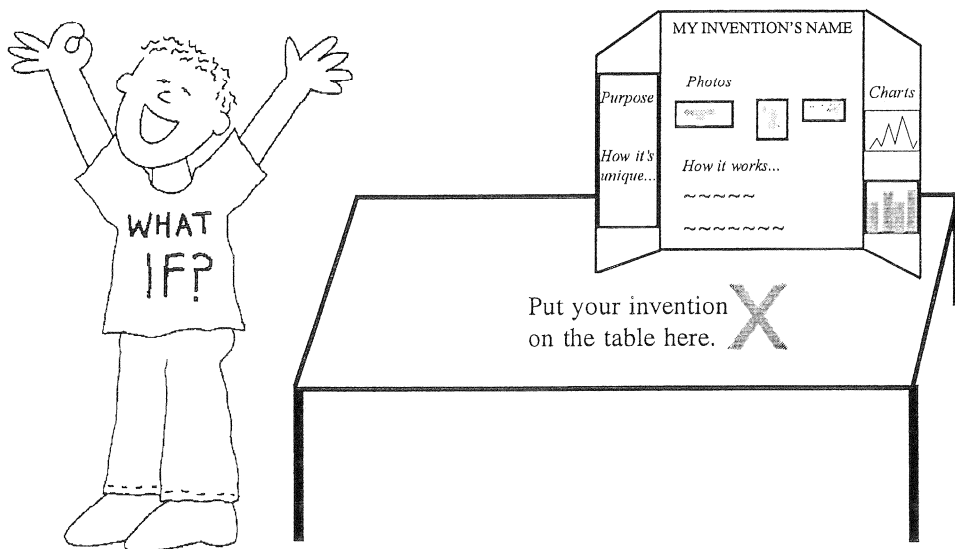


INVENTION DISPLAY BOARDS

When you exhibit your invention, part of your display can include a display board to help describe your invention to visitors. **Display boards used at the regional Young Inventors Fair should follow the guidelines below.**

- Ready-made, three-panel display boards can be inexpensively purchased from most office supply stores. This is a very easy way to create a board for mounting invention information.
- Display boards can be placed on top of the table or fit over part of the front of the display area. Boards cannot cover the invention number which labels your invention for the public.
- Display boards may be taped onto the display area, but the display table cannot be damaged. All information on display boards (written or pictures) should be permanently affixed to the board. No pins or tacks, please.
- Written information on the display board should include the invention's name or title, It can also include things like: the story of your invention, the purpose of the invention, how it improves life for others, how it works, and/or diagrams and pictures. Younger students can dictate descriptions to an adult who can help place the information on the board.
- It is your responsibility, as a student inventor, to bring all that is needed (materials and human resources) to set up your invention display at the regional Young Inventors Fair.



Your invention and display board should fit on half of a banquet table. The display board above is an example. Look on the next page for more ideas for your board.
